Dear Parents and Guardians

Welcome back to Term 2. It is great to see the students back at school for what will be a longer than usual 11 week term.

The key message the school is giving to the students, makes reference to the critical learning which takes place in Term 2 and Term 3. Term 4 is a very, very short term for the senior

students particularly. Term 2 is uninterrupted by internal examinations and is a good block of time in which major learning takes place. I have been impressing on the students the importance of completing all tasks and activities in each subject. Whether they count for credits or not is immaterial to the learning. The importance and connectedness of these activities have been carefully thought through by teachers. Each gives important skill and knowledge from which further learning can stem.

I also encourage students to discuss, with their parents each night, what they have learned during the day. This is important reflection which actively grows learning capability and the dendrite connections within their brains. In presenting information, in their own language, students actively assist themselves in their understanding. I would encourage parents to engage in this activity as it is valuable and has little additional demand on time.

We are on the eve of the Takapuna Grammar School Board of Trustees elections. We have a very strong field of nominations and I encourage the community to be actively involved in electing candidates to the six parent positions we have available. Further material will be sent to your home, including the voting papers.

I also encourage you to attend this year's production, *Fiddler on the Roof* starting at the Bruce Mason Theatre on the 11 May. It will be a great show.

Surfing

At the combined TGS/Rangitoto college surfing competition, five competitors from TGS entered. The team also competed in an open entry tag team event where Julian and Isaac's team came 2nd. Congratulations to; **Tom Mason** placed 1st in Yr9 division, **Isaac Mennie** placed 2nd in Yr9 division, **Julian Speck** placed 4th place in Yr11 and under division and **Josh Murray** made it through to the semi finals.

Surf Life Saving

Jayson Hodgson, **Dalton Haase** and **Nicklas Livock** were part of a Surf Life Boat team who recently competed at the National Surf Lifesaving Champs held at Ohope Beach. This was the boys' first year of competition and they finished in 6th place in the final of the U19 Men's Long Course Surfboat event. This is a significant achievement with over 1,200 competitors from 44 clubs. Notably, they were the only boat crew from Red Beach Surf Lifesaving Club (SLC) to accomplish reaching a 2010 national final.

In addition, **Dalton Haase** gained 2nd in the Under 16 Boys Beach Sprint Relay with the team from Red Beach SLC.

Madison Farrell recently competed in the Mairangi Surf Life Saving Club Championships. Competing in her age group she won; Gold Medal - Beach Sprints, Gold Medal - Beach Flags, Gold Medal - Board Race, Gold Medal - Ironwoman / Diamond Event (swim - run - board - run) and Silver Medal - Surf Swim.

Tennis

Emmett MacLaurin, **Ben Davies**, **Mikaela Davies** and **Andressa Ferriera** was selected to play in the New Zealand Secondary Schools Mixed Tournament and played off for 6th place.

Triathlon

Andrew Ranford - 2nd Senior Boys at the Triathlon Auckland Championships. Andrew also won the open men's Olympic distance triathlon in a very respectable time of 1 hour and 58 minutes. He was aiming to complete it in under 2 hours, and coming first was a bonus. Over the summer he has showed some good form in the Junior Elite (19 an under) trans-Tasman race series. Great start to debating for newcomers

Takapuna Grammar School participates in the Auckland Schools Debating competition each year. This year most of the students from TGS are first time debaters so all credit goes to them for their successes in Term 1.

Senior Open 1 (Year 11) has won both debates so far – the first a prepared debate against Northcote on “Lifting sanctions on Fiji” and the second a limited preparation debate against Rangitoto on “Ethical Eating”. Senior Open 2 (Year 11 and 12) followed suit and won their second debate against Orewa also on “Ethical Eating”.

The Advanced Open (Year 13) team has won both rounds so far; against Rangitoto on “GST changes” and against Rutherford on “Mining in New Zealand’s reserved areas”. Their debates are all limited preparation with only one hour to get the topic and prepare a case. Rachel Love from the Senior team also stepped up most capably when the Advanced team was short on numbers.

Ensuring that your child knows that you understand and are willing to support him/her is critical to self-esteem and future opportunities as it is actually knowing how and what to do. This workshop focuses on aspects of reading for meaning, spelling tricky words and organising ideas on paper whilst being supported by teachers. Parents can also bring their child to this workshop. It is highly interactive and fun. Parents of children who show signs of a learning difference in their 8-18yr old children should attend.
