I understand that:

- if I use someone else's ideas or their work, whether that be art, music, writing for example, I am required to acknowledge that I have done so and the best way to do this is through **referencing**. Not to do so is **academic dishonesty**.
- the following are examples of types of academic dishonesty:

Cheating	Communicating with another candidate in an examination or assessment, bringing unauthorised material into an examination room or assessment, including on electronic devices, or consulting such material during an examination or assessment in order to gain an unfair advantage
Collaboration	Supporting another student by allowing your work to be copied or submitted for assessment (NOTE – both parties lose the grade for that assessment if there is collaboration)
Duplication	Presenting the same work for more than one assessment without adapting it to meet the specific assessment criteria
Falsifying data	Creating or altering data and presenting it as if it had been collected in an appropriate way.
Plagiarism	Copying and representing the ideas or work of another person as your own, including copying from the internet
